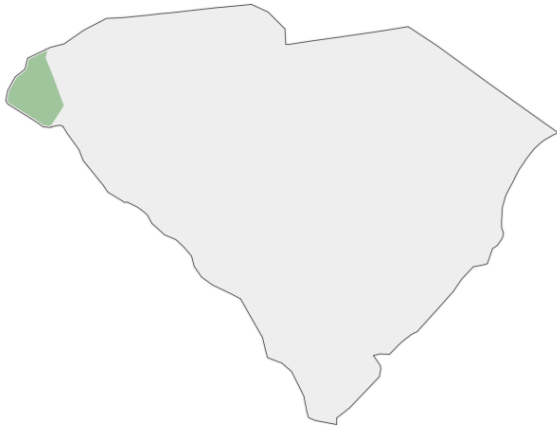

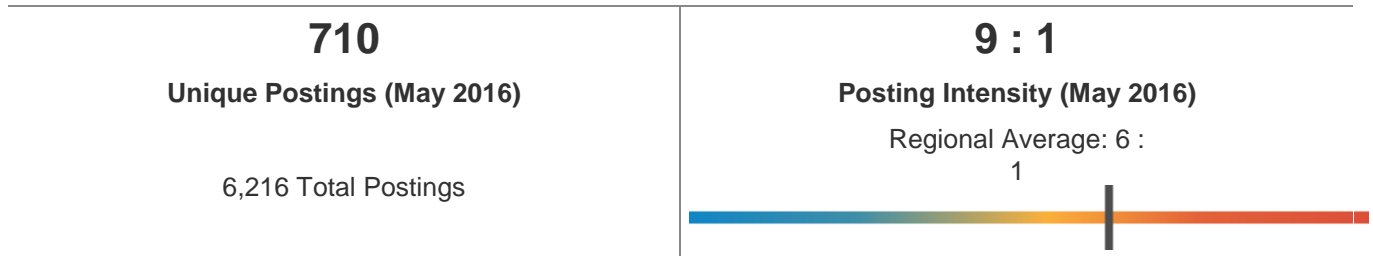

Job Postings Summary



There were **6,216** total job postings for 65 Occupations in May 2016, of which **710** were unique. These numbers give us a Posting Intensity of **9-to-1**, meaning that for every 9 postings there is 1 unique job posting. This is higher than the Posting Intensity for all other occupations and companies in the region (6-to-1), indicating that companies may be trying harder to hire this position.

Occupation Gender Breakdown



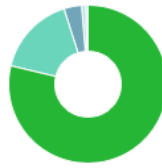

Appendix B - Data Sources and Calculations

Location Quotient

Location quotient (LQ) is a way of quantifying how concentrated a particular industry, cluster, occupation, or demographic group is in a region as compared to the nation. It can reveal what makes a particular region unique in comparison to the national average.

Occupation Data

Emsi occupation employment data are based on final Emsi industry data and final Emsi staffing patterns. Wage estimates are based on Occupational Employment Statistics (QCEW and Non-QCEW Employees classes of worker) and the American Community Survey (Self-Employed and Extended Proprietors). Occupational wage estimates also affected by county-level Emsi earnings by industry.

Completers Data

The completers data in this report is taken directly from the national IPEDS database published by the U.S. Department of Education's National Center for Education Statistics.

Institution Data

The institution data in this report is taken directly from the national IPEDS database published by the U.S. Department of Education's National Center for Education Statistics.

State Data Sources

This report uses state data from the following agencies: Georgia Department of Labor, Workforce Information and Analysis, Occupational Information Services Unit; North Carolina Department of Commerce, Labor and Economic Analysis Division; South Carolina Employment Security Commission, Labor Market Information Department
